Subject: Additional charge in the grade of Additional/Joint Commissioner of Customs & Central Excise and rotation between sensitive and non-sensitive charge- regarding .

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to Office Order No.92/2010 dated 23.04.2010 regarding posting/transfers of officers in the grade of Additional/Joint Commissioner during AGT-2010.

2. After issuance of the said transfer order, a number of posts in the grade of Additional/Joint Commissioner of Customs & Central Excise still remain vacant. The concerned Chief Commissioners / Directors General are, therefore, requested to issue necessary orders for giving additional charges of the vacant posts in the grade of Additional/Joint Commissioner to officers holding other charges in the grade, until further orders from the Board.

3. Attention is invited to para 10.2 of the Transfer Policy in terms of which an officer against whom the CVC has recommended initiation of vigilance proceedings, should not normally be posted or remain posted at the station where the cause of the vigilance proceedings originated. He shall also not be posted on a 'sensitive' charge. Further, as per CVC's instructions, officers have to be rotated between sensitive and non-sensitive charges after 2-3 years and send a report to DG(Vig.). The concerned Chief Commissioners /Directors General are requested to take necessary action accordingly.

4. Attention is also invited to para 4.7 of the Transfer Policy for IRS(C&CE) Group 'A' officers in accordance with which 'the officers will, as far as possible, be rotated between the Customs and Central Excise branches every two years and adequate experience in Service Tax branch will also be ensured as far as possible. This shall be done after the Annual Transfers have been effected. At stations where there are separate Chief Commissioners of Central Excise and Customs, a committee of all such Chief Commissioners shall collectively decide on the rotation between the two branches at that station. At other stations, local rotation will be done jointly by the Chief Commissioners who exercise control over the posts located at that station'. All Chief Commissioners/Directors General are requested to take necessary action according to the said provision of the Transfer Policy.

4. This issues with the approval of Member(P&V), CBEC.
